Prior to joining Reinvestment Fund, Sara worked as a nonprofit housing developer, directly contributing to the creation and preservation of over 1,000 units of affordable housing across the southeast, representing over \$220 million of affordable housing investment. Her previous experience also includes creating comprehensive city and county housing strategies and providing consultative input into affordable housing needs for communities across the southeast.

She has a PhD in Urban History and a Certificate in Planning and Economic Development from Georgia State University, where she studied affordable housing policy. Sara serves on the boards of HouseATL, the Atlanta Women's Affordable Housing Network, and the Friends School of Atlanta. She also serves as an advisor for community groups advocating for affordable housing and supporting our unhoused neighbors.
