## **Making Hairston Park More Family-Friendly**

airston Park could be a family-friendly destination for DeKalb County residents. the 33-acre park needs attractive landscaping and a few amenities. This proposal suggests making a sound investment in the park to better serve thousands of families in the area.

**Phase One**, to occur in 2017, features a new gazebo with picnic tables for family gatherings, three park benches, and six garbage cans. In addition, landscape improvement will be made to draw people into the park.


**Phase Two** features an updated playground and path improvements.

the median 200 feet on both sides of the entrance. The median end caps and corners of the entrance would have low, colorful shrubs.









#### Phase One - 2017 Improvements

The centerpiece of the Hairston Park improvements is the gazebo. The 45-foot structure is modelled after the ones at Wade Walker park. Six picnic tables would be placed on the cement floor.

The 45-foot structure is modelled after the ones at Wade Walker park. The improvements would include six picnic tables, three durable benches; sturdy, attractive garbage cans.

The telephone poles that are haphazardly lying on the ground near the parking lot would be removed. A row of cement stanchions would separate the parking lot from the park. A four-foot hedge of hardy, colorful shrubbery, such as loropetulum, would create a green wall between the cars and park.

Holly trees and bushes would line the median for 200 feet on S. Hairston, on both sides of the park entrance. This would beautify this portion of S. Hairston and serve to draw people into the park. Flowering bushes would mark the corners of the entrance.

### Phase Two, to occur in 2018:

Update the playgrounds in the park.

Add rubber mulch, three new benches, two water fountains, and a bicycle rack to the play area. Patch and resurface the path as needed. Heavily prune and mulch the nature path around the lake. Fence in a 10'-30'-foot area for a doggie park.
