SCOPE OF WORK

100 Black Men of America DeKalb, Inc. (100BMOD) provides mentoring services across a lifetime to help people achieve educational excellence, health and wellness, economic empowerment, and leadership development. Our dedicated membership of “Real Men Giving Real Time” through our Mentoring the 100 Way Across A Lifetime® curriculum and programmatic initiatives make a holistic and sustainable impact on the quality of life for youth, families, and communities served. The 100 BMOD is a leading service organization in the community with its primary focus on mentoring tomorrow’s leaders today.

100 BMOD boasts of its flagship program, Leadership Academy, for middle and high school boys and girls throughout DeKalb County and outspreads to students from across the metropolitan area, providing life and leadership skills training, as well as mentoring. Moreover, the chapter partners with several organizations like the DeKalb County School District, DeKalb County Government and DeKalb County Sherriff’s Office to further extend its reach to young people outside of its program.

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Grantee shall provide the following services:

I. General

1. The 100 Black Men of DeKalb shall provide a safe space and place for youth to have a culturally enriching learning experience in a supportive environment that involves mentoring, self-actualization, motivation, leadership, and career preparation.
2. The organization will provide materials, resources, food and travel for youth participants and staff.

II. Deliverables & Contractor Responsibilities

The 100 Black Men of DeKalb Leadership Academy is seeking a grant of \$10,000 to support its three core programs:

- **Entrepreneurship Contest Awards:** Recognizing and rewarding outstanding young entrepreneurs for their innovative business ideas and plans.
- **Scholars Board Essay Contest Awards:** Encouraging academic excellence and critical thinking skills among high school students through an essay competition.
- **Field Trip Scholarships for Lower- and Middle-Income Families:** Providing opportunities for underprivileged students to participate in educational field trips that enhance their learning experiences.

Program Descriptions:

- **Entrepreneurship Contest Awards:**
 - i. Open to high school students in DeKalb County.
 - ii. Participants submit business plans that demonstrate creativity, feasibility, and potential for social impact.
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 - iv. A panel of judges evaluates the submissions and awards prizes to the top finalists.
 - v. Prizes can include cash awards, mentorship opportunities, and access to business resources.
- **Scholars Board Essay Contest Awards:**
 - vi. Open to high school students in DeKalb County.
 - vii. Participants write essays on a designated topic related to leadership, community service, or social justice.
 - viii. Essays are evaluated based on clarity, originality, and overall quality.
 - ix. Awards are given to the top essay writers, recognizing their academic achievements and potential for future success.

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- **Field Trip Scholarships for Lower- and Middle-Income Families:**
 - i. Provides financial assistance to families who cannot afford the cost of educational field trips.
 - ii. Scholarships cover the transportation, admission fees, and other expenses associated with field trips.
 - iii. Field trips are designed to complement the students' classroom learning and expose them to new experiences and opportunities.

Grant Priorities:

The grant will be used to:

- Increase the number of participants in the Entrepreneurship Contest and Scholars Board Essay Contest.
- Expand the reach of the Field Trip Scholarships to serve more underprivileged students.
- Provide mentorship and support to program participants throughout their academic and professional journeys.
