RE: Nomination for Appointment of an Elected Official for Membership on the DeKalb Community

Service Board (CSB) - Commissioner Kathie Gannon

Dear Ms. Simms and Mr. Brown:

## **Background Information**

On April 16, 2014, Governor Nathan Deal signed Senate Bill 349 into law. This new legislation made a significant change to the governing board structure for community service boards and affects how the DeKalb County Board of Commissioners will appoint members to the DeKalb CSB's Governing Board.

The new legislation creates new a category of governing board member effective July 1, 2014. In addition to the *citizen volunteers* who desire to serve as members of the governing board, the Board of Commissioners will also appoint members who are *Members Holding Elective or Appointive Office*. The Board of Commissioners may appoint these *Members Holding Elective or Appointive Office* beginning May 1, 2014.

The statute defines "elective or appointive office" as:

- (i) the Chief Executive Officer of DeKalb County;
- (ii) an elected member of the DeKalb County Board of Commissioners;
- (iii) the county manager of DeKalb County;
- (iv) the Sheriff of DeKalb County;
- (v) the elected chief executive officer, by whatever name called, an elected member of the governing authority, or an appointed city manager or any municipality lying wholly or partially within DeKalb County:



- (vi) a member of the board of education of DeKalb County or a member of the governing board of any municipal school system lying wholly or partially within DeKalb County;
- (vii) the school superintendent of DeKalb County or the superintendent of any municipal school system lying wholly or partially within DeKalb County;
- (viii) the appointed public safety commissioner, police chief, or fire chief of DeKalb County or any municipality lying wholly or partially within DeKalb County; or
- (ix) any other elected official from within DeKalb County.

The statute prescribes that an elected official will serve a member term equal to the official's term of office. An appointed official will serve for three fiscal years, the same as other members. However, a member appointed to one of these positions may not continue to serve on the Governing Board after leaving the office that initially made him or her eligible to serve as a member.

The statute requires that the number of board member slots designated for *Members Holding Elective or Appointive Office* shall be one-third of the number of board slots designated for citizen volunteers. Accordingly, based on the provision of the statute, the DeKalb CSB must have nine (9) board member slots for citizen volunteers. Therefore, three (3) board member slots must be appropriated for elected or appointed officials.

Presently, Debra DeBerry, Clerk of Superior Court, has served on the DeKalb CSB's Governing Board since November, 2014 and it is anticipated that she will continue to serve in this capacity through the remainder of her current term in office.

## **DeKalb CSB NOMINATION**

Of the three (3) board member slots that have been designated for *Members Holding Elective or Appointive Office* two (2) are vacant. The following elected official has indicated their willingness and desire to serve on the DeKalb CSB's Governing Board:

> Commissioner Kathie Gannon, DeKalb County

At its January 25, 2018 meeting, the DeKalb CSB's Governing Board voted to nominate Commissioner Gannon to the DeKalb County Board of Commissioners for its consideration of her appointment to the Governing Board.
