Sara A. Fountain, Executive Director, Retired Leadership DeKalb, Inc.

Ms. Fountain was employed as Executive Director of Leadership DeKalb, Inc., a community leadership program that offers leadership training to adults and high school students, from November 2001 until her retirement in September 2012. During that time, she increased the size of the organization and its scope of leadership that led to several honors bestowed on her and the organization. In 2012, Leadership DeKalb created the Sara Fountain *Carpe Diem* Award and she was the first recipient of that award.

Ms. Fountain has been involved with community advocacy and quality of life issues for over three decades. Her primary personal interests are in sustainable and environmentally responsible growth, public health issues, and education. She has held management positions at Agnes Scott College, the Georgia Nurses Foundation, Associated Regional Accounting Firms, and Crumbley & Associates among others. She began her career at the Savannah Evening Press newspaper and worked in advertising, public relations and marketing for several agencies. She has received over 40 national, regional and local awards for her expertise in marketing communications.

She is a member of the national Advisory Board of the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences at her alma mater, Georgia Southern University, and is a founding member of New-Power, a fundraising PAC to elect women to public office in Georgia. She is the chair of the Board of Trustees of the DeKalb Library System and a member of the Advisory Board of Break-Thru House, a treatment facility in Decatur for women with addictions. She is a graduate of the 1992 class of Leadership DeKalb and a 2004 graduate of the Regional Leadership Institute.

Ms. Fountain has served as a member of the Emory University Board of Visitors and on the Clifton Community Partnership, a coalition of citizens working with Emory to help guide the redevelopment of the university and the surrounding area.
