Isaac Blythers retired May 1, 2005 as President of Atlanta Gas Light Company & Chattanooga Gas Company, a position he held from June 2002 until his retirement. He had direct responsibility for the regulated utility operations serving 280 communities and 1.5 million customers in Georgia and Tennessee. He held a number of executive level positions prior to assuming the position of President. After retirement he served as Interim Executive Director of The Tubman African American Museum in Macon, Georgia from August 2005 to March 2006.

Blythers received his BS in accounting from Morris Brown College. A graduate of Stone & Webster Management Development Course, he has also received Industry Management course credit through Georgia State University, Georgia Institute of Technology, University of Houston, Baylor University and Texas A&I University.

Blythers is a 4 year US Navy Veteran and served 2 tours of duty in Vietnam aboard the USS Ranger CVA-61.
