

**A JOINT POLICY STATEMENT BY THE GOVERNING AUTHORITY
OF DEKALB COUNTY, GEORGIA, TO ADDRESS THE CHRONIC
ISSUE OF ILLEGAL SCRAP TIRE DUMPING**

Policy Statement:

The Governing Authority of DeKalb County is committed to a clean, safe, and healthy environment for all residents. To move from a reactive cleanup posture to a proactive prevention model, we hereby establish the following three pillars:

1. **A United Front on Legislative Advocacy:** The County will work to ensure that local ordinances and policies reflect the most effective practices for deterring environmental crimes. We remain committed to partnering with State leaders to advocate for legislative frameworks that provide local governments with the necessary tools to address large-scale illegal dumping and protect the public health and safety of our community. Additionally, the County will continue to promote intergovernmental coordination with relevant State and Federal partners to bring these partners to the table and conduct in dialogue around proposed solutions.
2. **Strategic Resource Allocation:** We pledge to align County resources and expertise to proactively address environmental blight and restore affected areas. By prioritizing the efficient use of personnel and technology, we will support continuous abatement efforts and explore innovative, sustainable solutions that transform environmental challenges into long-term infrastructure benefits for our residents.
3. **Enhancing Accountability and Stakeholder Collaboration:** The County will foster a culture of shared responsibility by strengthening collaboration between government agencies, the business community, and our residents. We will promote transparency and compliance through enhanced communication and streamlined reporting, ensuring that all stakeholders are empowered to participate in the responsible stewardship of DeKalb County's environment.
