- 1. Ed Williams, P.O. Box 361626 Decatur, GA 30036 Good Morning Commissioners. My Name is Ed Williams, I have lived in unincorporated south DeKalb for over twenty years. I am the chair of the group Concerned Citizens for Effective Government. I have seven major points to make this morning.
- DeKalb County's method of funding the DeKalb Pension obligations is not equitable to all the residents in both unincorporated and municipalities of DeKalb County regarding legacy liability.
- The BOC should require MARTA to restore all the Bus routes that were terminated on April 20 in DeKalb County. Because the BOC has not done so, I have filed a complaint with the Federal Transit Administration.
- The residents who live in unincorporated DeKalb interests are being neglected compared to the interests of the cities and the county as a whole. Unincorporated DeKalb must have proportional representation.
- DeKalb County should not give federal coronavirus money to cities in DeKalb without an IGA or contract agreement. Cities are created by the state, they are not constituents of a county. Municipalities are a separate and independent form of government under the Georgia Constitution.
- The CEO should appoint a new chair to the county charter review commission. A sitting judge should not chair a political commission for several ethical and legal reasons.
- DeKalb County should continue to invest in more coronavirus testing sites and quicker test results for the residents of DeKalb County.
- DeKalb County should commit to providing the resources and funding needed to eliminate the election problems for the election in November.

I have made several efforts to expose the inequities using the "see something and say something" approach and warn the commission. Today, I ask the board not to remain silent. Will you be the voice who says enough, and stand up and represent all the people?

There is a disparity between municipalities and unincorporated residents in how the DeKalb Pension plan is being funded with the property tax funds.

One of the problems with the DeKalb pension is that much of the liability was created before 2008 when more than 80 percent of residents lived in unincorporated DeKalb. The population has shifted to municipalities but the burden has not.

The unfunded obligations of the pension should be paid from the county general fund. Other jurisdictions pay their pension liability from their General Fund.

The commission should demand equity for MARTA services, Pension, and CARES, and SPLOST funding.

If you do nothing the people will seek redress from the courts. Thank You

2. Stephen Binney, (no address) - Good Morning Commissioners, History does repeat itself. On the agenda today is item #0826, a change order #3 to extend for a year the contract to the Georgia Minority Supplier Development Council for the review, approval and tracking of LSBE certifications and the monitoring of contracts to ensure compliance with the Dekalb First LSBE Ordinance. This is a department that has been disorganized, inefficient, corrupt and openly used for fraud for nearly 15 years. The commission apparently

does not see a problem with this. Let's look at the history of LSBE. Formed in November of 2006 to encourage local small businesses to remain in Dekalb County. After an investigation throughout 2008 and 2009 a report was presented to Judge Gregory Adams outlining many problems and abuses with the LSBE program. An investigation in 2012 showed none of the recommendations had been instituted and in fact the LSBE program was overtly being used for fraud and paybacks. In 2015, in an effort to clean things up, Georgia Minority Supplier Development Council was put in charge of monitoring the LSBE program, Over the last 5 years the county has given the Council over 1.5 million dollars and what have we got to show for it? The inability to find files, files stored in cardboard boxes scattered across the floors, information on applications not verified. Defrauding a woman of over 8 thousand dollars. Delaying a 62 million dollar watershed expenditure because LSBE does not do its job. What does the commission do about this except refuse to act and push things down the road. The Office of Independent Internal Audit issued a report on the LSBE last year. There were 10 areas of noncompliance, including no finalized operating procedures to administer the modified 2016 LSBE program passed by this commission 5 years ago. Incomplete prime contractor profile information, pertinent data fields left blank or filled with a description, such as "John Doe". 10 recommendations were suggested in the report. Does the commission know if any of these recommendations have been implemented? But here you are getting ready to spend 280 thousand dollars of good money with a bad company that has proven itself to be ineffective and open to corruption over the last 5 years. The definition of insanity is to do the same thing over and over again expecting different results. How much are we paying you now? We are not getting a good bang for our buck

The planning department has shown us that that we have a government willing to get the job done and they been innovative and effective in giving us hope that a change is going to come. VRE urgently needs a Communications Manager to assist with all aspects of voter communications between now and the end of the 2020 voter cycle. The already unprecedented November 2020 general election is now being beset by unprecedented misinformation and disruption of key services, such as undermining of the USPS. Please consider adoption by DeKalb County of a major commitment to Vote Early Day (https://www.voteearlyday.org/), such as launching a "DeKalb Early Voting Day" campaign culminating in the first National Early Voting Day on October 24, 2020. The most important way to reduce concerns about the function of USPS, the safety and security of absentee ballots, and post-election disruptions of vote counting is

to achieve as much early in-person voting and very early submission of absentee ballots either by USPS or drop box as possible. This campaign can be a responsibility of the Communications Manager noted above
