C. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

The purpose of public comment is to allow the public to voice county-related requests, concerns or opinions during the Commission meeting. Speakers will only have the opportunity for one public comment per meeting. Public comments may be made in person or submitted by sending an email no longer than one page to PublicComments@dekalbcountyga.gov which must be received between 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on the day of the meeting. Only those emails received during the allotted time may be read aloud. Public comment emails received outside of the allotted time will be included in the public comment record for the next meeting after receipt of those emails.The body of your email must include your first and last name, followed by your address. By submitting an email for public comment at any time, you agree to have your name, address and email entered into the record/minutes. Each in-person speaker must complete a speaker card and present it to the clerk before the beginning of the public comment portion of the meeting.

Cards must be turned in to the clerk from the time the general meeting is convened (generally 9 A.M.) and by the beginning of public comment portion generally following presentations on the agenda. The clerk will accept cards on a first-come, first-served basis. Prior to the clerk's call for public comment, in-person speakers who are residents of DeKalb County shall be allowed to speak before residents of other counties are allowed to speak. Once the public comment portion of the meeting begins, speaker cards will no longer be accepted. Speakers will be allowed to speak for three minutes each and public comment shall not exceed 30 minutes in length. When the buzzer sounds to indicate that time has run out, the speaker will be expected to immediately cease speaking and to yield the podium. Those in-person attendees who submitted speaker cards but did not speak because of the time allotment will be allowed to speak first at the next regularly scheduled Commission meeting without regard to residence. If time remains in the proscribed public comment portion of said meeting, email comments will be read into the record by the clerk or designee. Any remaining email public comments received between 9:00 am and 10:00 a.m. on the day of the meeting not read into the record will be submitted into the minutes by the clerk or designee and shall be forwarded to each commissioner by email. Speakers should always talk directly into the microphone and begin by stating their name, full address and the name of any organization they represent. Abusive, profane or derogatory language, holding up signs, clapping, yelling, standing or laying in the aisles to show support for or opposition to a speaker will not be permitted, but a show of hands or quietly standing in place will be permitted to show support for or opposition to a speaker's position.

Public Comments- November 15, 2022 Unread Emails

1. Ed Williams (No Address)- Good Morning Commissioners My Name is Ed Williams, I have lived in DeKalb for over twenty years. I am the chair of the group Concerned Citizens for Effective Government. I greet you with the words of Maya Angelou Here on the pulse of this new day, You may have the grace to look up and out and into your sister's eyes, and into your brother's face, your country and say simply very simply with hope [I Say] Good Morning." In two hundred years a lot has changed in DeKalb County since its creation in 1822. But every time I look at Stone Mountain, the Rock, I am reminded of how far we have to go. The Confederate carving on Stone Mountain is rebranded with lasers, animated with colored beams of lights to glorify the image as if it is coming back to life fight again the Civil War. The Rock, today calls you to [its] riverside, If you will study war no more. Come, Clad in peace and I will sing the songs I am reminded of the theme from Good Times, like the Evans family, many Georgians are struggling to keep their heads above water and fighting for equity, Struggling to make a payment, making a wave when we can, Scratchin' and survivin'. and Hangin' for Good Times. The confederate carving on Stone Mountain should be put in a museum and removed from the face of the Rock. Georgia was not the capital of the Confederacy. None of these men in the carving were from Georgia, There was no battle at Stone Mountain, and there is no one buried at Stone Mountain. So why is it called a Confederate Memorial? The truth should be told not glorified. The defenders seek to rebrand the symbolism of oppression and terrorism as art and history. The Confederates States of America sought to spread slavery and wanted to continue it in its Constitution. The carving on the Rock is a legacy of the KKK and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. The moment the statues and monuments were created the lie was told. It is not history. Maya Angelou in 1993 told the story of the Rock as she said, "the Rock cries out to us, clearly, forcefully," "Come, you may stand upon my Back and face your distant destiny, But seek no haven in my shadow." "you may stand on me, But do not hide your face.", Said the, "The singing River and the wise Rock." "Plant yourself beside the River. You, who gave me my first name, you Pawnee, Apache, Seneca, you Cherokee Nation, who rested with me, then Forced on bloody feet, left me to the employment of Other seekers--desperate for gain, Starving for gold." "History, despite its wrenching pain, Cannot be unlived, but if faced With courage, need not be lived again." Some say let it be, why make trouble? just accept things as they are. I dream in colors and I reject history that excludes my story. 'There are those that look at things the way they are, and ask why? I dream of things that never were, and ask why not?' A museum is not a remedy or substitute, the carving on Rock should be made more inclusive to add other figures or it should be removed. "The horizon leans forward, Offering you space to place new steps of change. Here, on the pulse of this fine day You may have the courage To look up and out and upon me, the Rock, the River, the Tree, your country. Good Morning

Public Comments- November 15, 2022 Read Emails

1. Mary Hinkel, 1718 Mason Mill Road Atlanta, GA 30329- Speaking for DeKalb Citizens Advocacy Council: On July 27, 2021, we made public comments to the Board of Commissioners regarding the important role technology has played in making it possible for the public to access meetings virtually. In one-on-one meetings with at least four Commissioners, we encouraged the establishment of virtual access to all County board meetings, including this Board. Knowing that an investment of time and money would be required, we suggested a plan be put in place for making this possible as soon as practical. We acknowledge that DCTV has added value by televising meetings and providing videos on demand of certain board meetings. However, it still does not cover all public board meetings. Further, the experience of making public comment in real time is very different from commenting via email. Almost a year and a half since our public request, we have had no response to our suggestions. Now the Board of Commission meetings is meeting in-person with no Zoom access for members of the public. Other boards such as Decide DeKalb are returning to in person meetings in places that provide no virtual access for the public. We see this not as a failure by DeKalb staff, but a failure of leadership and vision by this Administration. The benefits of providing Zoom access for many residents of DeKalb County far outweigh any expense or inconvenience to the county Administration. Citizen engagement is critical to the success of any government today, and hybrid meetings can provide an enormous return on investment. We remind you that one of pandemic "positives"—and there aren't many of them—was the ability for all citizens to participate electronically in board and other county advisory meetings. Consider the young parents of small children, who want to participate, but family duties prevent it. Consider the older citizen or one who doesn't drive. Each could participate without having to arrange sometimes costly and inconvenient transportation. Consider the workers who can't get the time off to schlep to the Maloof building just to hear what is going on in their County. If the Administration has a plan in place for providing hybrid capabilities in the Maloof building, as well as other County facilities, please make those plans public so they can be reviewed and commented on by citizens. The citizens of DeKalb County deserve as much access to County meetings as possible—and many other organizations have demonstrated that hybrid meetings are very possible. If the Administration doesn't have a plan, we ask that you, the Board of Commissioners, direct the CEO to establish such a plan. And, we would add, any plan without a timetable and reporting requirements for implementation is NOT a plan, it's just a piece of paper.

D. 10:00 A.M. PUBLIC HEARING

Citizens may speak for or against an item that is considered by law to be a zoning ordinance and each side will have ten minutes to present its case. Citizens may also speak for or against an item that is placed on the public hearing agenda but is not a zoning ordinance. In that case, each side will have five minutes to present its case. In the event there is more than one speaker per side, speakers must divide their time in order to complete their full presentation within the ten-minute time allotment, or the five minute time allotment. When the buzzer sounds to indicate that time has run out, the speaker will be expected to immediately cease speaking and to leave the podium area. Citizens may also email statements or documents related to public hearing items for inclusion in the public record by submitting such statements or materials by 9:00 a.m. on the date of the public hearing to PublicHearing@dekalbcountyga.gov. The body of your email must include a reference to the particular public hearing item to which your statement or documents apply by agenda number and your first and last name, followed by your address. By submitting an email related to any public hearing item, you agree to have your name, address and email entered into the record/minutes. In-person comments will be heard first. Prior to speaking, an in-person speaker shall complete a speaker card and present it when approaching the podium. If an in-person speaker has any documents for the commissioners, the speaker shall provide 10 copies when approaching the podium. Seven copies are for the commissioners and the remaining copies are for the planning director, the county attorney and the clerk. In all zoning ordinance and traffic calming cases, staff shall make their recommendation for action to the Commission first followed by applicants or citizens speaking in favor of the item. Applicants in zoning ordinance cases shall have the right to reserve time for rebuttal. Opponents of a zoning ordinance item shall have no right of rebuttal. For all other items placed on the public hearing agenda, applicants or citizens speaking in favor of the item shall speak first followed by opponents of the item.

If time remains in the appropriate public hearing portion of said meeting, email comments will be read into the record by the clerk or designee. Any remaining email public comments not read into the record will be submitted into the minutes by the clerk or designee and shall be forwarded to each commissioner by email. Once the citizens have finished speaking, staff shall make a recommendation for action to the Commission. At this point, citizens are no longer allowed to speak unless called to the podium by an individual commissioner to answer questions or provide information. In-person Speakers should always talk directly into the microphone and begin by stating their name, address and the name of any organization they represent. Abusive, profane or derogatory language will not be permitted. Holding up signs, clapping, yelling, standing or laying in the aisles to show support for or opposition to a speaker will not be permitted, but a show of hands or quietly standing in place will be permitted to show support for or opposition to a speaker's position.
