Justification if recommendation of award is to a firm other than the highest scoring proposer:

R&D requests an Estimated Multi-award recommendation for 4 vendors above (MME, EnviroWaste, Pateco and Sweeping Corporation of America, Inc.).

Approx. 1,000 catch basins and associated storm drain systems require aggressive action to clear debris that developed over time. (Debris includes dirt, grass clippings, water bottles, animal carcasses, motor oil and more). This is the first approach to service for the County's inventory of more than 25,000 Catch Basins.

The 4 recommended vendors to provide sufficient manpower and elaborate equipment needed to support and approach environmental factors involved to efficiently unclog and clean the catch basins (in accordance to the County, State and Federal protocol) to mitigate flooding of roadways and property within DeKalb County.
