15. SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT (See instruction on reverse)

The Improving Criminal Justice Responses to Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Program is authorized by the Violence Against Women Act, as reauthorized, codified at 34 U.S.C. 10461-10465, and implemented through regulations at 28 C.F.R. Part 90, Subpart D. The program enhances victim safety and offender accountability in cases of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking by encouraging jurisdictions to work collaboratively with community partners to identify problems and share ideas that will result in effective responses to these crimes. An integral component of this program is the creation and enhancement of a coordinated community response that brings together criminal justice agencies, victim services providers, and community organizations that respond to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

The DeKalb County Magistrate Court with its non-profit, non-governmental victim service providers Women's Resource Center to End Domestic Violence and Tapestri, will use this supplement to increase compliance with Protective Orders and to strengthen legal advocacy services for victims of domestic violence, dating

violence, sexual assault and stalking. Specifically the project will: 1) monitor compliance under Protective Orders, increase the reporting of non-compliance for victims and provide real consequences for Protective Order violations including arrest through the provision of a dedicated Compliance Officer; 2) provide on-site legal advocacy at the DeKalb County Superior Court; 3) provide culturally and linguistically appropriate advocacy to underserved populations during and after Protective Order hearings; 4) provide legal counsel to indigent survivors whose abusive partners hire an attorney; 5) use evidenced-based indicators to assess the risk of homicide during Protective Order Hearings; and 6) provide advocacy for victims as they apply for T and U visas.		
The timing for performance of this supplemental award is 36 months.
