The protection of and service to the citizens of DeKalb County, Georgia is the reason the DeKalb County Police Department exists. In realizing this purpose, one of the department's greatest areas of concern is roadway safety. Monitoring the County streets has the potential to prevent injury and save lives. In the past, DeKalb County Police Department has worked closely with the Governor's Office of Highway Safety to implement strategies towards meeting the goal of making Georgia's highways and streets safe for everyone. While the department has achieved some successes, persistent law enforcement-oriented vigilance in the areas of speeding, impaired drivers, aggressive driving and documentation/planning are necessary.

DeKalb County is located immediately to the east of the City of Atlanta although a small portion of the corporate city limits of Atlanta exists within its borders. DeKalb County is bordered by Fulton County to the west, Gwinnett County to the north and east and Henry, Clayton and Rockdale Counties to the south. DeKalb County has the largest area of coverage as it relates to the Georgia Interstate System with I-285, I-85, I-20, I-675 and numerous State Routes. The county's population of approximately 740,000 residents ranks fourth among all counties in Georgia and occupies an area of 268 square miles and represents 7% of the state population. DeKalb County is one of the most densely populated counties in the State. DeKalb County shares many thoroughfares with and is in proximity to several other local law enforcement agencies. These include the cities of Atlanta, Avondale Estates, Brookhaven, Decatur, Doraville, Dunwoody, Chamblee, Clarkston, Lithonia, Pine Lake, Stone Mountain, Stone Crest and Tucker; the DeKalb County Sheriff Department, Emory University; Agnes Scott College; Georgia Perimeter College; Marta and State and Federal Law Enforcement Agencies. The majority of DeKalb County's population (67%) falls between 18 and 64 years of age. Currently, there are over 500,000 registered drivers in DeKalb County. Given the mean commute time of 30.5 minutes (as compared to 27.0 minutes statewide); there are ample opportunities for crashes.

In CY2019, DeKalb County Police Department recorded a total of 52,262 roadway crashes (+18.79%) that occurred on DeKalb roadways. As a result, there was a slight increase in crashes during this period. In contrast, in CY 2018, there were 51,261 roadway crashes, 17,470 individuals injured and 105 roadway crashes fatalities. In CY2017, DeKalb County Police Department recorded a total of 51,604 roadway crashes that occurred on roadways, 16,917 individuals injured and 94 roadway fatalities. The reasons for the crashes are varied. In DeKalb County, the likely causes are aggressive driving/excessive speed and impaired driving. In the last three years, DeKalb County Police Department has identified specific locations within the county to have a higher ratio of crashes and increased our traffic enforcement within these areas. Our traffic enforcement efforts have made a significant difference in keeping our roadways safe.

A number of circumstances contribute to the risk of a vehicle crashes; aggressive driving, speeding, distracted drivers (texting while driving) and impaired drivers, just to name a few. Aggressive Driving is the most likely reason for crashes; contributing factors are following too closely, improper lane change, failure to yield and

speed. Speed is considered a factor in more than one-half of all crashes resulting in a fatality and approximately one-fourth of all crashes. While speeding, drunk driving, and drug use have long been common factors in vehicle crashes, the problem of texting and other use of electronics behind the wheel is relatively new. A distracted driver is a motorist that redirects his or her attention from the road, normally to talk on a cell phone, or send a text message. To this end, DeKalb County Police Department has increased its efforts to reduce vehicle accidents and fatalities. In CY 2019, DeKalb County Police Department issued 8,980 citations for speeding, 2,662 citations for seat belt violations and issued 1,721 citations for distracted driving.

With the stigma and the penalties attached to DUI, impaired driving is often the most cited reason for serious traffic crashes in DeKalb County. Impaired driving (DUI) includes driving under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs and prescription medications. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, drivers using alcohol are 4.4 times more likely to become involved in a crash.

In CY 2019, DeKalb County Police Department determined that out of 42,295 vehicle crashes that occurred on the roadway, 265 crashes were attributed to alcohol which resulted in 12 fatalities. In CY 2019, there were 52,262 vehicle crashes on DeKalb roadways, 267 of those crashes were related to alcohol and 14 resulted in fatalities. Pedestrian fatalities for 2019 were at 25. In contrast, in CY 2018, DeKalb County Police Department determined that out of 51,261 vehicle crashes that occurred on the roadway, 253 crashes were attributed to alcohol which resulted in 52 fatalities. For that same period, 2018 pedestrian fatalities were at 44 which was the highest of the five year average. In CY 2016, there was a total of 48,664 vehicle crashes that occurred on the roadway, 284 crashes were attributed to alcohol which resulted in 11 fatalities. Even though the number of vehicle crashes has increased over the last three years, the number of vehicle crashes attributed to alcohol and fatalities has decreased. Since April 2004, it has become harder to demonstrate the link between drug use and crashes. Cooper vs. State changed the rules regarding when blood can be drawn at the site of a serious crash. Traditionally, units were allowed to take blood samples on any driver involved in a serious crash. Now units must first establish probable cause before blood can be drawn. Unless a driver is either visibly intoxicated or evidence of intoxicants are visible, probable cause can't be determined. The result has been a significant decrease in the number of alcohol or Intoxicant-related citations and possibly an under-counting of alcohol-related accidents. In CY 2020, DeKalb County Police Department made 243 arrests for DUI while also training new mandate classes on how to detect and arrest impaired drivers on the roadways. Pedestrian fatalities have been a major issue for Dekalb county and will be addressed in the coming years.

During FY 2020, the HEAT Unit participated in numerous multi-jurisdictional events. The unit concentrated its efforts on impaired driving, occupant protection, and speeding. The HEAT Unit received monthly project related training through Metro Atlanta Traffic Enforcement Network (MATEN) meetings and other outlets. They participated in multijurisdictional events all across the state of Georgia in connection with GOHS sponsored events. The HEAT unit attended all of the MATEN meetings and was honored to host one of the monthly meetings here in DeKalb. As a HEAT Unit grantee, the unit was directly and actively involved in all of the enforcement campaigns sponsored by the Governor's Office of Highway Safety and National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Those campaigns, also known as One Hundred Days of Summer HEAT, included the following:

- "Operation Zero Tolerance"
- · "Click It or Ticket"
- "Operation Rolling Thunder"
- · "Hands Across The Border"
- "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over"

The mobile breath testing vehicle, better known as the BAT Mobile, was deployed to most of those events to bring awareness to the unit's mission and to maximize visibility around metro Atlanta.

In FY 2020, the HEAT unit was able to complete individual and team training such as: in-service training, traffic related certifications, Metro Atlanta Traffic Enforcement Network training sessions, other classes offered by the county academy and GPSTC, Ethics Training, Defensive Driving Training, state traffic enforcement conferences, and smaller courses locally. In addition, the HEAT Team provided training to numerous agencies and individuals in the DeKalb County Police Department, DeKalb Citizens' Academy, and other local police agencies.

The STAR Team/Heat Unit answered many requests, to assist various community groups, court officials, schools, churches and public education organizers and participated in a large number of special events, details, and assignments. The HEAT resources were utilized to:

The DeKalb County Police Department is fortunate in that the department publishes its own monthly newsletter and routinely produces footage for the County's cable access television channel. The Department also uses social media outlets such as Twitter and Facebook. Additionally, through the use of the department's Public Information Specialists, Public Education Specialists and Community & Multi-Media Relations unit, the department can communicate with all of the major television and radio stations, the Atlanta Journal Constitution as well as smaller groups such as the schools, neighborhood and community associations. The department also makes special efforts to reach out to the culturally diverse members of DeKalb County through the Latin American Affairs Liaison. The liaison identifies and addresses the needs and the concerns of the Latin American Community in DeKalb County as it relates to public safety issues. Grant-related activities will be publicized using one or more of the outlets outlined above. The department will announce the grant through the Atlanta Journal Constitution. Also, the department will announce the grant through the following television stations: WSBTV, WAGA, and DCPV (DeKalb County Public Television).

Three enforcement/activity hour resources will be assigned to the DeKalb County PD HEAT Unit. The enforcement effort will consist of 6,240 activity hours annually (40 hours per week x 3 positions x 52 weeks per year) assigned by supervision to ensure maximum manpower at any given time. Activity hours may also be used for educational events, attendance to the GOHS Highway Safety Conference, highway safety related training/certifications, etc. Activity hours will be filled by resources that hold the appropriate certifications on traffic enforcement equipment. Crash data will be used as a hot spot locator to target enforcement in high problem areas. Resources assigned to the HEAT unit will be required to maintain training in SFST, Radar, Laser, Intox and at least one CPST. Ongoing training must be highway safety related and only SFST, Lidar, and Radar trained personnel will be eligible for the federally funded enforcement grant activity hours. Resources that do not hold certifications in ARIDE will work toward obtaining an ARIDE certification within a calendar year of being assigned to the grant

Vehicle maintenance (three vehicles).

This application requests funds Vehicle Maintenance to include gas, oil, brake, and tire replacement for vehicles used during activity hours (3 HEAT vehicles/units).

Funds are requested for travel to the GOHS Governor's Challenge Awards Banquet and training as well as other GOHS approved training, including the phlebotomy program. HEAT vehicles will be used for transportation to the training sessions and also used by network coordinators for travel to the LEL conferences. The cost of travel will be \$3,500 for the unit.

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#### Continuation Plan

Federal Funding guidelines require that each funded project indicate how the activities of the project will be continued after federal funds are no longer provided. The continuation plan must identify potential sources of non-federal funds.

The DeKalb County Police Department appreciates the support that GOHS has given over the past sixteen years. In the event that the federal funding is no longer provided, DeKalb County will strive to continue the program through a combination of multi-jurisdictional partnerships, agency collaborations, seeking other grant opportunities and county funding.

#### Multi-jurisdictional Partnerships

Most task forces do not have adequate staffing to hold DUI safety checks on busy Metropolitan Atlanta streets without additional manpower. However, agreements with agencies to provide mutual aid at a particular time on a given date can overcome this challenge. The MATEN meetings provide an opportunity for DeKalb County Police Department to network with other jurisdictions. The department would work to maintain the networks that have been established.

#### Agency collaborations

This grant application explores working with other agencies with similar mandates to achieve more than DKPD can alone. The partnership to be established DeKalb Fire and Rescue and DeKalb Board of Health in the area of child safety could be expanded such that costs and staffing needed to improve this area could be shared. The department would also work to establish similar partnerships to share the workload and costs.

#### County funding

DeKalb County is proud of the work the HEAT Unit achieves and the community education it provides. We would like to see these efforts continued. Should all grant possibilities, partnerships, and collaborations produce a shortfall; the County would work to preserve as much of the program as possible given budget priorities and constraints.
