PURPOSE:

To consider accepting \$247,852.00 for the DeKalb County Adult Felony Drug Court from the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council and appropriating the amount to a new Grant Fund.

NEED/IMPACT:

The Criminal Justice Coordinating Council has awarded \$247,852.00 to the DeKalb County Adult Felony Drug Court to use toward staff training, psychiatric & nursing services, counseling services, housing, medication, drug testing & monitoring supplies, and transportation costs for program participants. The grant period is from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The required cash match (\$27,539) will be met through the Superior Court Operating and DATE Fund budget.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding for all services provided by Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Grant in the amount of \$247,852.00. Funding has to be spent by June 30th 2020, end of State FY 2020.
